DECISION MINUTES

GENERAL ASSEMBLY 30.09+01.10.2021

Bellevue Park Hotel Riga Latvia

1. Welcome speech of the President

The President, Mrs. Annette Sjödin, opened the Meeting at 09.00 am and welcomed those present. She expressed the wish of the Board that this Assembly, as always, would be a meeting where participants showed mutual respect, were able to compromise and make decisions for the benefit of the cat. She said that it was her sad duty to inform the Assembly that the FIFe Judges Mrs. Ursula Loose, Mrs. Elisabeth Steinhauser, Mr. Boris Lupan, Mrs. Gina Grob and Mr. Trilukito Priosembadha had died and she asked all those present to observe a minute of silence. She then declared the GA 2021 officially opened. The President said that if anyone wanted matters to be taken to the minutes, this should be explicitly requested and all changes or rewording of proposals (including the page number) should be submitted in writing and sent by email to the General Secretary and the Vice Secretary, in English, German and French. She stated that Lux Cat Club-FFL (LU) submitted a written request to vote by secret ballot for the duration of the entire General Assembly.

With reference to article 4.6 of the Statutes, the President confirmed that the Vice President, Mr. Dietmar Sagurski and the Vice Treasurer, Mr. Karl Preiss would assist her in chairing the meeting. She stated that the Disciplinary Commission (DC) would be represented by Mr. Joeri Vanrusselt, the Judges & Standards Commission (JSC) by Mrs. Donatella Mastrangelo, the Show Commission (SC) by Mrs. Thea Friškovec-Keller, the Breeding & Registration Commission (BRC) by Mr. Ole Amstrup, the Health & Welfare Commission (HWC) by Mrs. Carin Sahlberg and the Breed Councils by Mrs. Nathalie Smits-Peelen (BCA). The President also informed that the Controllers were represented by Mr. Jürg Keller-Friškovec; since the other Controller, Mrs. Marie-France Pohl, was expected to arrive after the lunchbreak today. Also the Cattery name administrator, Mrs. Eva Wiéland-Schilla, and the Show calendar administrator, Mrs. Dorte Kaae were present.

The President sent the regards from the General Secretary, Mr. Eric Reijers, who unfortunately could not attend this Meeting due to health reasons.

Finally, she said that the coffee, tea and lunch breaks would take place according to schedule and she asked all present to switch off their mobile phones or put them on silent mode.

She gave the floor to the Vice Secretary, Mr. Charles Spijker, who called the Roll of the Delegates.

The Vice Secretary announced that there were now **28** (twenty-eight) Members present and **7** (seven) proxies. After 14:30 this would be **29** (twenty-nine) Members present and **6** (six) proxies. The total number of votes will be **35** (thirty-five), the absolute majority was established at **18** (eighteen) and the qualified majority (3/4) at **27** (twenty-seven).

3. Election of two Scrutineers and three Supervisors for the Minutes of the GA 2021

FBE (BE) proposed Mrs. Stéphanie Dupont as Supervisor for the French version of the Minutes. CPF (PT) proposed Mr. Krzysztof Czyżkowski and Mr. Jürg Keller-Friškovec as Scrutineers. CPF proposed Mrs. Bette Lind as Supervisor for the English version of the 2021 GA Minutes, Mrs. Liz Parry for the French version and Mr. Herbert Steinhauser for the German version. FBE then withdrew the candidacy of Mrs. Dupont. The Scrutineers (Mr. Czyżkowski and Mr. Keller-Friškovec) and the Supervisors (Mrs. Lind, Mrs. Parry and Mr. Steinhauser) were duly elected.

4. Drafting of the Minutes

The President stated that the minutes of the meeting are usually made by the General Secretary. Since he is not present, the Board proposed that the Vice Secretary, Mr. Charles Spijker, would be responsible for drafting the minutes. There was no need for a vote and the GA agreed.

5. Approval of the Agenda

The President said that requests were on the table for changes in the order to deal with the proposals on the agenda: SK (FI) proposal 2 before FBE (BE) proposal 2 on page 15-16, BRC proposal 13 before FD (DK) proposal 2 on page 16, BRC proposal 3 before BRC proposal 14 on page 18, Board proposal 1 before JSC proposal 8 on page 25, FFM (MX) proposal 1 before AFA (AR) proposal 3 on page 28 and FFM (MX) proposal 2 before AFA (AR) proposal 4 on page 28.

On behalf of the BRC, Mr. Amstrup stated that two proposals on the agenda are dealing with adding new varieties to already recognised breeds. He pointed out that the Breeding & Registration Rules, chapter 11, deals with the recognition of a new variety. § 11.1 states that variety is used as a concept covering a cat's coat colour or any other trait. A new variety is an EMS code not earlier recognised in a specific breed. Mr. Amstrup stated that two proposals on the agenda, proposal 2 from Mundikat (page 10) and proposal 4 from SVERAK (page 12) both dealt with adding new EMS codes to an existing breed. This was a violation of the Breeding & Registration Rules. Since the procedure for recognition was not followed, it is, in the opinion of the BRC, not possible to deal with these two proposals. He requested his statements to be taken to the minutes.

The President informed the GA that she received information from SVERAK that their proposal 4 was withdrawn.

Mr. Frank, the delegate of Mundikat, said he would think about withdrawing their proposal if there was no other possibility. He noted that when the same proposal was on the agenda of the last GA, it was not an issue. The President asked Mr. Frank if he would like to have the Meeting vote whether to deal with the proposal and Mr. Frank agreed with this suggestion.

The result of the votes was that Mundikat proposal 2 will remain on the agenda.

There were no other speakers and with the changes listed above, the agenda was approved.

22. Information on the World Cat Congress (WCC)

The President informed the Assembly that nothing had happened with respect to the WCC since its last meeting because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Just last week, the WCC Secretary sent a letter with some queries on future activities. Apart from that, there is nothing to report on the WCC.

23. Miscellaneous

The President asked if anyone had anything to raise under this agenda item.

Mr. Karl Preiss asked the floor and wondered, now we voted that Maine Coon with EMS code 09 shall not be registered and shown as such if it has blue eyes, how we find out that the cat has blue eyes? After all, we do not register eye colour at all with 09 cats. So how can we find this out to exclude this cat from breeding? My question to the BRC: how do we handle this situation? Mr. Preiss asked to minute his question.

On behalf of the BRC, Mr. Amstrup stated that is up to the breeder to inform the registrar that the cat has this eye colour. Consequently, it should be registered as an XLH with the appropriate codes for colour and pattern, then code 61 for blue eyes, followed by the EMS code of the originating breed between pointed brackets: XLH * 61 <MCO>.

The President informed the Assembly that the Board decided to schedule two theoretical exam sessions: on Friday 14th January 2022 in Vienna and on Friday 27th May 2022 in connection with the General Assembly.

The President thanked Mr. Dietmar Sagurski, Mrs. Vanja Knez, Mrs. Carin Sahlberg, Mr. Martin Urban and Mr. Ole Amstrup for their years as FIFe officials and all the work they had done. This was met with applause.

24. Close of the General Assembly

The President asked Mrs. Linda Riekstina and Mrs. Lena Vencliková, the representatives of the Latvian respectively the Czech Member, to come forward to hand over the FIFe flag. The 2022 General Assembly will be organised on Thursday 26th and Friday 27th of May in Plzeň, Czech Republic.

The President thanked everyone for the good atmosphere and good comments and then declared the 2021 General Assembly in Riga, Latvia, officially closed at 16:00.

A cattery name shall not contain:

- More than 18 letters or signs
- An EMS code or any other abbreviation for any breed or name of breed (exceptions are made for individual members residing in countries as outlined in Appendix III)
- The word "cattery" in any language.

5.2.3 Application for a cattery name

A cattery name may only be registered if no other identical or similar name, which might give rise to confusion, is listed in the BCN, unless an official governmental cattery name registration is applicable in the country of residence. In those cases, the official country code must be added to the cattery name. FIFe members who must respect an official governmental cattery name registration must always inform the FIFe board, so that a list of countries where this is applicable, can be maintained. Exceptions are made for individual members residing in countries as outlined in Appendix III.

In order to obtain re-registration in the target breed, one or more cats participating in a breeding programme can be shown in the Control class (class 13b, \rightarrow § 9.1.3) at any generation after the F1 generation after the crossbreeding. Cats of F1-generation resulting from an individual case of allowed crossbreeding cannot be presented in class 13b for re-registration; this does not apply to breeds with permitted outcross: PEB and SRL/SRS (\rightarrow § 6).

It is the National FIFe Members' responsibility to check and confirm that all requirements as laid down in § 9 are fulfilled prior to permitting cats to be shown in the Control class (class 13b).

The theoretical part can be taken after the Student Judge has examined at least 75% of the cats required.

All necessary documents as required and laid down in § 2.1.8, 2.1.10, 2.1.11, 2.1.16 and 2.1.18 must be attached.

The application should include:

- the choice of Category, e.g.: category 1, 2, 3 or 4
- the venue (date, place, country) where the candidate intends to sit for the theoretical examination (if available)
- the show (date, place, country) where the candidate intends to sit for the practical examination,
- the FIFe Language in which the exam will be taken,
- the names of the examining Judges for the practical exam (if available)

The FIFe General Secretary must receive this application at least two months prior to the date of the examination. For this purpose, the FIFe has issued a special form: this standard application is the only valid application form.

In cases where the date and venue of the practical examination and/or the names of the examining Judges are missing in the above mentioned application, this information must be sent by email by the FIFe Member to the FIFe General Secretary when applying for permission to sit for the practical examination and must be received at least two weeks prior to the intended date for the practical examination.
